

Study grants for students attending universities or universities of applied sciences

A service of the government of South Tyrol

General Description

The province of South Tyrol provides **study grants** for students at universities, universities of applied sciences or equivalent institutions, which are awarded through public competitions.

Students can be granted an annual scholarship if, in addition to the general requirements, they have achieved the required academic success, have not exceeded the legal duration of their course of study taking into account the respective tolerance period and have not received any other support measures for the same course of study. The amount of the **study grant is calculated on the basis of the economic situation of the family**.

As of the academic year 2019/2020, the EEEV-DURP (Uniformed declaration of income and assets) will be introduced as the basis for determining study grants. The EEEV-DURP with the FWL-VSE (economic situation factor) as a measure of the financial situation of a family are **free of charge** and can be obtained from any **Patronat-patronato** (mediator centre between citizens and public bodies) **and CAF** (tax assistance centre). Make an appointment now – since the EEEV-DURP declaration must already be available when applying a study grant in order to indicate the FWL-VSE! Eligibility Requirements

Students are eligible, if they:

- attend a **university in South Tyrol**;
- are **non-EU citizens**, attend a **university in South Tyrol** and have been **registered in South Tyrol for at least one year**;
- attend a **university outside South Tyrol** and have been **registered in South Tyrol for at least two uninterrupted years**;
- attend a university and are completing their **first** bachelor, master or equivalent degree as regular students;
- have not reached the **age of 35** and are enrolled in a three-year bachelor or equivalent degree (1st cycle);
- have not reached the **age of 40** and are, after a bachelor or equivalent degree, enrolled in a consecutive master degree (MA, MSc), in an academic course (e.g. at a music conservatorium) of the 2nd cycle, or in a diploma or magister degree (according to the old study regulations: 1st + 2nd cycle).

Required documents

The applicants declare the necessary data under their own responsibility. For this reason, the local administration largely refrains from handling original documents, but carries out **random checks** on the truthfulness of the declarations. **False declarations will be sanctioned** and in serious cases, criminal charges will be filed.

Costs

The use of this service is free of charge.

Reference to legal provisions; ordinances

This measure falls within the scope of [Provincial Law No 9 of 30 November 2004 on the entitlement to higher education](#).

[Decision No 561/2019](#) adopted the new regulation, and [Decision No 562/2019](#) adopted the call for competition for the academic year 2019/20.

Rules for online applications for study grants

As far as the **online application for study grants** is concerned, identification is carried out exclusively via the digital identity **SPID** ("Sistema Pubblico di Identità Digitale") or an activated **citizen/health card**. **Only** those students who **do not have Italian citizenship** at the time of application and **do not have a valid identity document** (identity card, driving licence, passport) issued by an Italian authority can access the e-government system with a **certified account**.

Access to the e-government service offered to students who have Italian citizenship or a valid Italian identity document at the time of application is exclusively via:

- the digital identity **SPID** ("Sistema Pubblico di Identità Digitale") or
- an **activated citizen/health card**, used with a card reader.

With **SPID**, the public system for digital identity, individuals of full age with Italian citizenship or a valid Italian identity document receive a **single digital identity (user name and password)** and consequently access to all online services of the public administration. Registration is carried out with one of the eight SPID providers. Students who **do not have Italian citizenship** at the time of application and **do not have a valid identity document (identity card, driving licence, passport) issued by an Italian authority** can only access the e-government system with a **certified account** (please note: the tax number of the Revenue Agency is not an identity document!). Only these students are entitled to have a certified account created at the Amt für Hochschulförderung-Ufficio per il diritto allo studio universitario, where they must present the official tax number of the Agenzia delle Entrate and an identity card/passport.

Communication with students takes place **exclusively via** publication on **the website** of the Amt für Hochschulförderung-Ufficio per il diritto allo studio universitario www.provinz.bz.it/studienbeihilfe **or via e-mail**.

The **provisional and definitive rankings** of study grants are published at www.provinz.bz.it/studienbeihilfe. The results are published on the basis of a transaction number, which is automatically assigned to each application and is visible on it. The dates of publication of the results are indicated in the table "Deadlines".

ATTENTION: There will be **no notification of the results by mail or e-mail** to the students!
